American Academy in Rome (<http://www.aarome.org>)

- Several fellowships for study abroad are offered in the following categories: architecture, conservation, graphic design, historical preservation, industrial design, interior design, landscape architecture, set design, visual arts, and the history of art
- Fellowships range from six months to two years with stipends ranging from \$9,000 to \$17,800
- fall/spring semester, or summer

American-Scandinavian Foundation (www.amscan.org)

- Awards fellowships and grants to students, scholars, professionals and artists to travel to Scandinavia
- Applicants must present a well-defined research project; some language may be required
- Teaching positions available in Finland

The Asia Pacific Leadership Program, East West Center; Hawaii (<http://education.eastwestcenter.org/aplp/>)

- For early to mid-career professionals and students for across the Asia Pacific region and the United States
- Funded by the Freeman Foundation

- Sponsored by the Ministry of Science, Research and Arts; Baden Wurttemberg, Germany
- Supported by NAFSA: Association of the International Educators, and the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (AACRAO)

- Non-profit organization offers several programs for students and non-students
- Work in Australia and New Zealand, Russia and Venezuela

- Some programs offer volunteer/internship opportunities, while some charge a fee

- Sponsored by the National Science Foundation (NSF) and the Institute of International Education (IIE)
- a fellowship opportunity for U.S. graduate students in science and engineering who are seeking a quality hands-on international research experience in Austria, the Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Poland or Slovakia.

Council on International Educational Exchange (CIEE) www.ciee.org

- CIEE is a provider of study abroad, work abroad, internships and volunteering abroad programs throughout the world. They launched the educator-focused International Faculty Development Seminars (IFDS) in 1990 with the goal of encouraging U.S. colleges and universities to internationalize curricula. CIEE has offered over 150 seminar topics in nearly 40 countries since the inception of the IFDS series. CIEE works through the year to develop new themes and sites with our network of CIEE Study Centers, contacts and Academic Consortium members. Hosted by prestigious academic institutions abroad, the seminars are short-term, intensive experiences that offer you:
 - updates on global issues and regions that are shaping the course of world events
 - introductions to scholarly communities overseas
 - idea exchanges with international colleagues
 - the opportunity to re-examine your own discipline within an international context

- Student and professional exchanges to higher educational institutes in Germany
- Also research grants for college or graduate students and scholarships for German summer language courses

Department of Defense Dependent Schools (DoDDS), (<http://www.dodea.edu>)

- Teaching opportunities at U.S. Department of Defense schools both the United States and abroad
- Positions available for one to two years; pay comparable to urban U.S. schools

Friends of World Teaching-Nursing (<http://www.fowt.com>)

- Employs nurses and administrators in more than 100 overseas English-speaking schools and colleges
- Positions exist in all fields and at all levels from kindergarten to university
- Qualifications are similar to those in the United States. However, many English-speaking schools do not require state certification

The Fulbright Scholar Program (<http://www.cies.org/>)

Since 1947, more than 32,000 U.S. citizens and 34,000 citizens of other nations received grants from the Fulbright Scholar Program for faculty and professionals. Faculty may apply for this prestigious scholarship to conduct research and/or to lecture in almost any country in a wide variety of academic and professional fields. The Fulbright Scholar Program is administered by the Council for International Exchange of Scholars (CIES).

Apart from the U.S. Scholar Program, which is widely known and provides approximately 750 grants annually, there are also Special Programs for U.S. Scholars and the Visiting Scholar Program.

- Staff positions available for supervising high school/college groups in Belize, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Kenya, Zimbabwe, Nepal, Thailand, and Vietnam
- Students live and work with small rural communities

Institute of International Education-Department of State Fulbright Program (www.iie.org/fulbright)

- Fulbright Teacher Exchange Program; available for all educators and administrators
- Some language may be required; available for summer, semester, or year-long
- Leave of absence with regular salary pay

InterExchange (www.interexchange.org)

- Non-profit organization offers a variety of placements for students and non-students
- Housing and jobs are prearranged, and all positions are paid
- Examples include: Teaching English in Bulgaria, Costa Rica, Czech Republic, and Hungary; Internships or resort work in Germany; Agricultural work in Norway

Interlocken Center for Experiential Learning (<http://www.interlocken.org>)

- A variety of positions are available in the travel programs or the International Summer Camp
- Positions are 3-6 weeks in July and August
- Room and three meals per day are provided at the Int'l summer camp
- All room, board, and travel expenses are covered on the travel programs

International School Services (ISS), (www.iss.edu)

- Recruitment service for overseas schools looking for teaching staff (both elementary and secondary) and administrative positions
- Schools enroll children of international business families and diplomatic personnel. English is language of instruction, located in Africa, Asia, Central and South America, Europe, and the Near/Middle East
- Contracts are generally for two years; accepted applicants receive salary, room, board, and roundtrip airfare

Japan Exchange and Teaching (JET) Program (http://www.mofa.go.jp/j_info/visit/jet/)

- Sponsored by the Japanese government, JET invites 1,300 American college graduates and young professionals to share their language and culture with Japanese youth
- One year positions are available in schools and government offices throughout Japan

NAFSA: Association of International Educators: (www.nafsa.org)

- NAFSA offers tremendous opportunities for professional development. The best way to get involved is to volunteer during the regional conference so you get to know your regional team. If you're too shy to present, think about a poster session. They are non-threatening and are a great way to get over the fear of presenting.
- If you think you have nothing to share or present, you do! Think about successful programming you have done, or an idea you had to effect positive change at your institution, or work with a colleague in a different field to generate ideas about international education at your institution.
- NAFSA is also a co-sponsor (along with AACRAO) of the Baden-Württemberg Seminar in Germany and the Australian Familiarization Tour.
- Finally, consider the NAFSA Academy Class IV. This is a US Department of State funded project to train NAFSAns to become generalists in the field of international education. For more information, speak to your

Overseas Service Corps YMCA (OSCY),

- Provides an opportunity to teach conversational English in community based YMCAs in nine cities in Taiwan
- Minimum requirements: Bachelors degree
- Benefits include: A monthly stipend, return airfare, paid vacation, housing, and a bonus after completing the year of teaching. Minimum commitment is one year

- Private voluntary organization hiring adult chaperones for high school student travelers to Costa Rica for economic, social, and technical development training

The Peace Corps (www.peacecorps.gov)

- Peace Corps offers paid positions for employees able to train and assist Peace Corps volunteers throughout the world
- Domestic and overseas positions are available wherever Peace Corps offices are located
- Peace Corps participants receive all expenses paid, training, health insurance, and a "resettlement allowance" of over \$5,000 after completing the two-year assignment

Semester at Sea faculty/staff positions (<http://www.semesteratsea.com>)

- Teach on board the Semester at Sea cruise ship, sailing from port to port. Various positions available for all professional levels
- fall, spring, or summer term

- Information on several multi-year scholarship/internship programs geared towards students (especially women and minorities) interested in foreign affairs

Work Abroad for Students and Recent Graduates (CIEE: www.ciee.org or BUNAC: www.bunac.org.uk)

- Short-term paid work abroad positions
- For a reasonable fee, these companies assist participants to obtain work permits and finding a job abroad
- Positions are paid, but participant is responsible for transportation and living costs
