Dr. William (Jerry) Berberet Endowed Scholarship

The Dr. William (Jerry) Berberet Endowed Scholarship in History recognizes outstanding history majors with professional promise.

The renewable scholarship shall be awarded to students who meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Full-time
- Preference to a student from Montana
- Preference to a student with demonstrated financial need as determined by institutional and/or federal criteria (FAFSA)
- Declared history major
- Minimum 3.50 in required history courses, and overall GPA a minimum of 3.25
- Recipient selected by the history department in spring semester of the sophomore year to be awarded for the junior year and renewable for the senior year if grade requirement is met. Students must have completed a minimum of 36 credit hours to be eligible.
- Demonstrated promise for career in history as determined by the history department
- Award shall be \$1,000 annually.

Deadline to apply to the history department is February 23. The selection will be made by the history department no later than March 1. Please use the scholarship application on page two.
