

SEXUAL HARASSMENT AND SEXUAL MISCONDUCT/TITLE IX

The Physician Assistant (PA) Program is committed to maintaining a respectful, inclusive, and safe learning environment for all students. Mistreatment, harassment, and any form of discrimination undermine professional development and will not be tolerated in the classroom, clinical settings, or in any program-related activities.

PA students who believe they have experienced or witnessed mistreatment, harassment, or other unprofessional behavior are encouraged to report concerns promptly. Reports may be made to any of the following:

- PA Program Director or faculty member
- Carroll College Office of the Dean of Students
- Title IX Coordinator (for cases involving sexual harassment or discrimination)

Students also have the right to file a formal complaint through the College's student conduct process, which outlines procedures for preliminary investigation, hearings, and appeals. Supportive measures or interim actions may be implemented at any point during this process to ensure student safety and well-being.
