Attended Carroll Autumn 1950 thru Spring 1952,
and Spring 1956.

I regret to inform you of Dick's death on June 9, 2016 in Los Angeles, after developing several serious infections around a hip implant, which did not respond to antibiotics; surgery was not an option. He would have been 84 on June 16. He suffered for many years with severe rheumatoid arthritis and his hands and feet had become very deformed. He was confined to a wheelchair for the past few years, but never complained. In spite of his disabilities, he worked every day for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in downtown Los Angeles, retiring only three years ago! Many years ago, he was a Lieutenant in the U.S. Army, stationed in Germany. He later worked for the U.S. Forest Service in Montana, before his service with the Corps of Engineers. He was always active in musical theater and vocal groups.

His beloved daughter Fiona was with him when he died, and our brother Pat (Carroll class of 1957) and I were able to see him and talk to him about three weeks ago in L.A. His family, and many friends will miss him and his ever-cheerful attitude.

At his request he was cremated, and will be buried in the Fort Harrison U.S. Veteran's Cemetery, in his birthplace, Helena, MT. Interment and memorial service will be later.
